

John C. (Jack) Ellis K7SUQ Memorial Scholarship

- 1. A Sum of \$1,000.00, subject to available funds, donated annually by the Clark County Amateur Radio Club (CCARC) and or its members through membership donations, to provide funds for this scholarship.
- 2. The selection process will include the review of individual applications and interviews of the finalists by the Clark County Amateur Radio Club Scholarship Committee. Final approval by CCARC Board of Directors.
- 3. In order to be eligible for the scholarship, an applicant must:
- a. Hold a current valid Amateur Radio License, any class, issued by the United States Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

Priority will be given to Amateurs who are active in Amateur Radio related activities in their community.

- b. Plan to be a full-time student (at least 12 credit hours).
- c. Currently be a high school senior with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better, OR, if temporarily out of school for up to two years, have had a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or better, OR, if attending college, must have established a college GPA of 3.0 or better.
- d. Plan to, or be enrolled in a 2 or 4 year degree program at an accredited college or university.

Priority will be given to those with a college major in the fields of: Physical Sciences, Math, Engineering, Computer Science, OR, Education in one of the above.

- e. Be a U.S. citizen.
- f. Be a resident of Clark, Skamania, or Cowlitz County in the state of Washington, or a member of CCARC.
- g. Have been a well-rounded student and participated in other school and community activities.
- 4. The first half of the scholarship money will be paid in August directly to the applicant upon proof of acceptance to the college or university program. The second half of the money will be paid directly to the student in December upon proof of satisfactory completion (GPA of 2.0 or better and student in good standing) of fall term with at least 12 credit hours.
- 5. The scholarship will be null and void if not used within two years of the notification of the winner.
- 6. The scholarship recipients must maintain contact with the Clark County Amateur Radio Club to advise them of their academic progress while attending college or university. Recipient must write a thank-you letter to CCARC. This is for compliance with the non-profit status for the State of Washington.
- 7. Applications Please submit no earlier than November 1st and no later that February 1st (a 3 month window). Scholarship is for the academic year that will commence on or after May 15th.
