## AMATEUR RADIO FIELD DAY

**(Vancouver, WA, USA)** Living in the Pacific Northwest means, at times, living with hazards such as flooding, high winds, heavy snow fall and a host of other threats to life and property. Together with potential technological hazards such as train derailments hazardous material releases and wildfires, a well-planned and well-integrated emergency management system needs to exist. Clark County is fortunate to have such a system.

One of the essential components in this emergency management system is a reliable and capable contingency communications network. Amateur (ham) radio provides a wide range of state-of-the-art communications in support of local and state emergency services.

Once each year, the amateur radio community nationwide establishes simulated emergency communications sites for the general public to visit and observe. This year, the Clark County Amateur Radio Club will establish such a site:

Visitors to the Field Day site be able to observe (and participate in if desired) high-frequency voice, data communications and satellite communications. Subject matter experts will be present to explain how each system operates.
